## News

### New PIM Gender Research Assistant

Caitlin Kieran (c.kieran@cgiar.org) recently joined PIM as a Senior Research Assistant focusing on gender. She will be working under Cheryl Doss's technical direction to support PIM's gender research efforts. Caitlin received a Masters in Public Administration from the Columbia School of International and Public Affairs (SIPA) in May 2013 where she focused on Economic and Political Development and completed a certificate in Gender Policy. While at SIPA, Caitlin worked as an Economics Department Research Assistant. Prior to joining IFPRI, she also worked as a Monitoring and Evaluation Consultant for The Hunger Project and as a Gender and Evaluation Intern on a food security program with USAID and Save the Children. ## Policy Processes Workshop

PIM and <u>A4NH</u> are co-organizing a workshop on <u>"Approaches and Methods for Policy Process Research"</u>. The workshop will take place in Washington, DC from 18-20 November. A call for case studies has been posted on the PIM website. Submissions are being accepted until 15 September.

## New Funding Approved for the Foresight Analysis Flagship under PIM

The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation recently approved a new three-year phase of funding for the Global Futures Strategic Foresight (GS/SF) Program. Researchers under the Program model an array of potential new technologies under varying assumptions about market conditions and climate scenarios to determine which would be most effective in meeting the

needs of poor producers and consumers. The Global Futures Program was already well under way when PIM was launched, and it has been expanded and broadened as a flagship within the CRP. The new funding will allow the team to expand upon existing analyses of scenarios and ex ante technology assessments, add new crops, initiate an increased focus on livestock and fish, and incorporate farming systems. Work on gender will be deepened, and analysis at the household level will be added by linking with the ongoing work under <a href="HarvestChoice">HarvestChoice</a> and other initiatives of the 10 partner centers of PIM.

## Global Center for Food Systems Innovation Symposium
